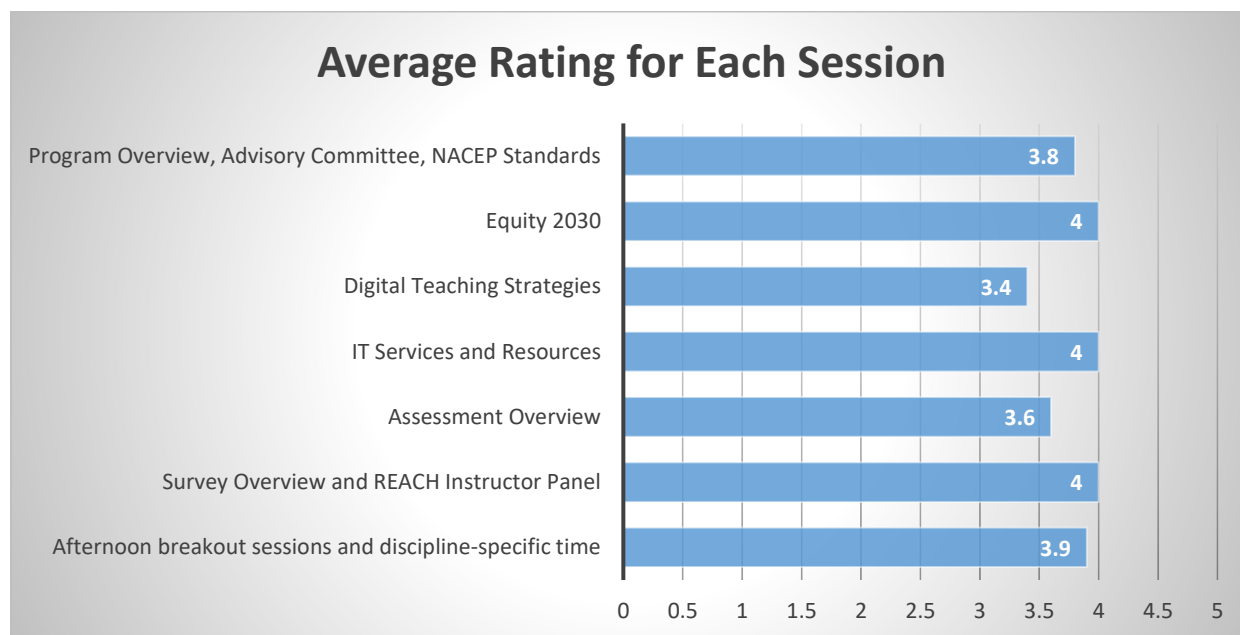


Minnesota West REACH Virtual Professional Development Day Feedback August 20, 2020

REACH Professional Development Day was held virtually for the first time, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Overall, the day was successful. In attendance were 43 REACH Instructors, 24 REACH mentors, and 3 high school staff/principals.

Program Overview, Advisory Committee, NACEP Standards

- Very helpful new resources and ideas. Thank you!

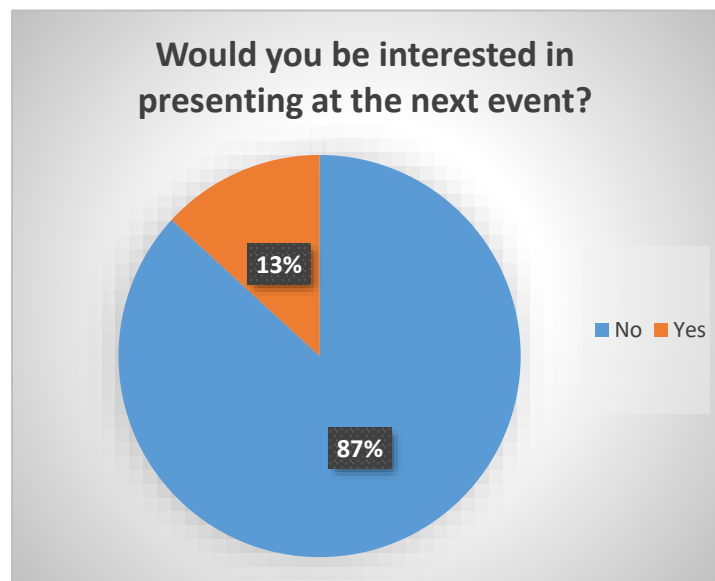
Afternoon breakout sessions and discipline-specific time

- This time would be better spent having mentors meet with mentees meet rather than clumping disciplines.

Are there any changes you would have made to the day?

- Go over the REACH forms in detail and share expectations or examples of what should be included and what is unnecessary.
- More time in breakout session would be beneficial.
- More interactive activities Maybe different tracks - beginner, intermediate, advanced. Although that doesn't necessarily mean years of working with REACH.
- Every year getting high school students admitted to the college is an issue, usually on their end. It would be nice to go over this process and have a step by step to do list to provide students that is easy to follow in order to get them through this process. I give them a print off that I've found on the REACH site and still have problems annually.
- Maybe invite a student panel to join us to share their specific experiences with the REACH program. Also, have more varying "meetings" for those who are new or seasoned people with the REACH program so the information isn't redundant, although a brief review is always helpful.
- I actually got more out of the day in the virtual format than when it's in person. I appreciated not having to travel and the preparation that Kayla, Theresa, and others did to make it a valuable online experience overall.

- Please separate those that are new to reach and those that have been doing it for a while. I have heard the same information for several years now. Please don't insult HS teachers by having college faculty show us how to use interactive tools that we have been using for many years.

- I didn't like the all-encompassing style (e.g. English, Communications, Spanish) of the discipline-specific time. I like the idea of working within the broader range of our discipline (all English mentors and mentees, for example), but the groups were too broad. This gave us less of an opportunity to discuss specific discipline-related questions.

Any topics you were hoping would be covered, or anything you'd like to learn more about?

- Do a session on what makes for a good site visit / notes / what is expected of mentors and mentees.
- I was hoping to connect with my mentor and get more specifics for the class I am going to teach.
- Interactive teaching strategies
- I would like to see more college level student work. When we meet to collaborate in the HS, we share student work, not just assignments or rubrics, so we can co-assess and discuss. I don't know if this is possible, but it would be helpful.
- Maybe do some breakout session. Cover D2L basics for REACH that may use or want to use D2L. More discipline-specific time.
- Maybe have some discussion on what mentors should be discussing with their mentee during a classroom visit. Also, a template for the mentor report would be helpful to go over.
- I think more specific time with our mentors in the small groups would be good. That's when we get the direct info we need and can more easily ask questions.
- If D2L is a recommendation/option for Reach teachers, maybe some training on how to set up your D2L site might be beneficial. I am guessing more people would give it a shot if some training was provided?
- Would have liked to learn more about paired assessment.
- More time to just work on my syllabus would have been nice.
- I feel like a separate meeting for first year instructors would be more effective. I feel like some things were rushed or assumed that we already knew when we didn't.
