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

 - Medical Coding Specialist, Diploma
 - The Medical Coding Specialist Program went through the PCAP Accreditation (Professional Certificate Approval Program) and received a 3 year accreditation. We had no flags or changes to what I submitted and so we are AHIMA PCAP accredited until April 30, 2022. We do have to do an annual attestation that is due March 31, 2020. The attestation includes any revisions or changes in the program. Currently, there are no revisions or changes to the Medical Coding Specialist Program since our PCAP accreditation Spring of 2019.
