**WELCOME:** Welcome to members and guests. Heather Moser was introduced as the new adjunct faculty. Heather is teaching Clinical Chemistry I and II.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

#### **TOPIC: Simulated Microbiology Lab**

DISCUSSION: Simulated Microbiology lab was held January 11 to 15, and January 19 to 22 at the Luverne Center. Instructor was Kristin Fritz who developed the course. Four students attended the course, one student was out on medical leave but will be acquiring her hours at her clinical site.

# **TOPIC:** Case Studies during Clinicals

DISCUSSION: In the past the Clinical student had to find a current patient with a disease/condition they could research, write a case study with research, and give a power point presentation. Due to COVID last year, Rita started writing case studies the student would read and answer questions. This year she is expanding the number of case studies. For the Capstone class, the student will chose one of them and give a power point presentation to hospital staff and classmates.

ACTION: Rita will assess the outcome of the students' knowledge gained from case studies and the Power Point presentations

DISCUSSION: There are five 2<sup>nd</sup> year MLTs currently in Clinicals, Four 1<sup>st</sup> year MLTs, and 4 phlebotomist. Enrollment is down in 4-year and 2-year colleges due to COVID. ONGOING

# **TOPIC: Marketing Updates**

DISCUSSION: Rita has given presentation to the following. All are virtual.

Rita sends "kits" that include an Influenza A/B test (the students swabs their mouth), bandaid with inspirational saying, agar plate with M&Ms, and MLT brochure. She gives a 40-minute power Point presentation about the career and MN West program. She will continue to do more presentations to hopefully improve enrollment.

#### **TOPIC: Clinicals 2020**

DISCUSSION: Last year, due to COVID, students were not allowed at Clinicals beginning around March 23<sup>rd</sup>. Throughout the semester Rita did varies activities including: Zoom lectures, case studies, virtual labs, and University of MN's hematology online differential slides. Around May, some students were back to Clinicals and some were not.

## **TOPIC: Job Placement**

DISCUSSION: 100% of 2020 graduates are employed in a medical laboratory. ONGOING

#### **TOPIC: Student assessment and statistics**

DISCUSSION: Members reviewed statistics provided (see handouts). 2019 grads: 100% passed board exam. 2020 grads: Had started 2018 with 11 students, graduated 9. 5 have passed the boards, 3 have failed (one has failed three times, the other 2 have not repeated the exam), and 1

has not taken boards yet but she has registered to take them. The three that have failed, English is their second language; not sure if that is a factor.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

## **TOPIC:** Equipment purchases and future equipment need

DISCUSSION: Equipment purchases this year are a Bloodbanking cell washer and HemCue. Both were purchased from Perkin Grant funds. A new centrifuge is needed; Rita will use donation money to purchase one. Rita is thinking of purchasing a CoaguCheck or equivalent. This can also be used by Medical Assistant and Phlebotomy students in Lab Skills course.

# **TOPIC: Program modification**

DISCUSSION: Due to offering the SIM Microbiology lab, the Microbiology Clinicals had to be separated into two courses. MDLT 2370 will be SIM Medical Microbiology for 2 credits and MDLT 2330: Clinical: Medical Microbiology will be reduced from 4 credits to 2 credits.

# **TOPIC: Outstanding Educator**

DISCUSSION: Rita received Minnesota State Board of Trustees Outstanding Educator for 2020. CLOSED

## **TOPIC: Minnesota Pipeline Grant**

DISCUSSION: Rita has had several meetings with Jenny Andersen-Martinez, HR Advisor for SW Minnesota & NW Iowa and Rachel Tingle, Talent Advisor over the lab area, regarding the Minnesota Pipeline Grant.

Information about the Grant:

- 1. Grant is a Partnership with the State of Minnesota and Sanford
- 2. If student works for a Sanford facility in Minnesota, they can apply to have 100% of their tuition paid for the MLT program.
- 3. Candidate can live in a different state but has to work at a Sanford hospital in Minnesota
- 4. Students apply through Sanford
- 5. Student is required to do 4 hours per month of on the job training while in school. They will get paid their same wage as they are getting paid in their current job at Sanford.
- 6. 2 year work commitment once pass MLT program

ACTION: OPEN

#### **TOPIC:** Microbiology hours and Clinical sites

DISCUSSION: Pipestone County Medical Center, Sanford Worthington, Lakes Regional in Spirit Lake, and Windom are the only hospitals in the area that have a full microbiology department. However, they are both short staffed and inudated with COVID testing. The VA Hospital in Sioux Falls takes 1 student each year and they do have microbiology. The sites used for microbiology that no longer have a microbiology department are Estherville, Rock Valley,

Marshall, Redwood Falls, and Sheldon. In April, Avera McKennan will take 2 students, 1 week each, for Bloodbanking; but did not have a spot for Microbiology.

Discussion was held regarding having the 2 weeks of Simulated Microbiology and 2 weeks of Clinical microbiology as it presently is. Some voiced that reducing the clinical experience to 1 week would be an injustice to the student. Another option would be to have the simulated micro lab for 3 weeks and no clinical experience at a hospital site. A decision was made to wait and see what the status of Microbiology sites next year.

## **TOPIC: MLT shortage**

Discussion: Laboratory managers were invited to attend the meeting to discuss the shortage of MLTs and possible marketing ideas. Comments were made that pay could be an issue why people are not going into the profession.

February 24<sup>th</sup> via Skype, representative from Sanford (Jenny Anderson, Leah Fisher, Tanya Adams, and Kris Schneekloth) met with representatives from MN West (Amber Luinenburg (marketing), Jackie Otkin (Dean of Allied Heath), and Rita Miller met to discuss the shortage. Information that was shared includes:

- 1. Sanford will conduct lab tours for students in Upward Bound 56 students will attend
- 2. Collaboration with Sanford Health, Worthington HS, and MN West to provide resources to Intro to Healthcare Careers Course in Fall 2021
- 3. MN West to have virtual scrub camp March 5<sup>th</sup>, currently 110 HS students are registered

Marketing ideas discussed at this meeting were:

- 1. Send MLT Program brochures to hospital sites
- 2. Social media
- 3. One-week long summer camp for 9<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> graders
- 4. Advertise on Indeed or other job search engines to get the people who have graduated with a BS in Biology, for example, that are looking for a job
- 5. Promotional videos
- 6. Bus students from small towns to Luverne for classes.
